3.0 DURATION OF PROJECT

- 3.1 Duration of project shall be One years from the date the Project has been sanctioned by DBT.

4.0 RIGHTS OF OWNERSHIP/TECHNOLOGY TRANSFER AND UTILIZATION

- 4.1 The know-how generated from the project by SIES will be the joint property of SIES and DBT, Government of India. The provisions of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 will be applicable and the award made thereunder shall be final and binding upon the parties hereto, subject to legal remedies available under the law. Such differences shall be deemed to be a submission to arbitration under the Indian Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996, or of any modifications or reenactments thereof.



1. Background

- 1.1. This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) made between the SIES college of Arts, Science and Commerce and ACCA provides for the establishment of a mutual co-operation between these two institutions.
- 1.2. Recognising the value of promoting mutual co-operation for the advancement of their respective members and the accountancy and tax professions, SIES college of Arts, Science and Commerce and ACCA agree to the following terms as set out below.

2. Purpose

- 2.1. The purpose of this MoU is to set out the understanding between the Parties without any intention to create legal relations, rather in the spirit of mutual cooperation. Any collaborative ventures that may bind the Parties are subject to separate contractual arrangements. The purpose of this MoU is to explore opportunities for collaboration to their mutual benefit, to set out the respective roles and responsibilities of the Parties in working cooperatively to further each other's and their mutual interests.
- 2.2. No funding will be required from either Party except as mutually agreed from time to time. The Parties agree that all financial arrangements will be negotiated for each specific case prior to commencement of the activity and will depend on the availability of funds.

3. Duration and Termination

- 3.1. This MOU will be deemed to have come into force and effect on the Commencement Date and will continue for a period of three (3) years from that date. The parties agree to review this MOU annually. This MOU may be terminated at any time during its term by either ACCA or SIES college of Arts, Science and Commerce upon three (3) months' prior written notice to the other.
- 3.2. Either party may terminate ("Terminating Party") this MOU by immediate written notice to the other party in the event of an occurrence of any act, omission or conduct which is deemed by the Terminating Party, at all times acting reasonably, to undermine, jeopardise or damage the professional reputation of the Terminating Party.
- 3.3. This MOU may be amended upon the mutual written agreement of both parties.

4. Specific areas of co-operation

ACCA undertakes to work together with SIES college of Arts, Science and Commerce in the following areas:

- 4.1. Provide access to ACCA professional development and learning resources
- 4.2. Learning and development initiatives - e.g. competencies, skills and training mapping, etc.
- 4.3. Jointly develop strategies and marketing campaigns to promote the global collaboration between College and ACCA
- 4.4. Work collaboratively and carry out joint engagement and outreach to promote and create awareness about ACCA trainings, Qualification, ACCA-X, master's programme and other relevant trainings
- 4.5. Joint partnership programmes supporting the training and development of students to prepare them for successful careers in accountancy and finance;
- 4.6. Explore and create new pathways for students to further their education and enhance their careers in accountancy and finance;
- 4.7. Enhance the employability of students through capacity building initiatives;
- 4.8. Tap into one another's networks of professional and industry contacts to support the above objectives

5. Other areas of co-operation

SIES college of Arts, Science and Commerce and ACCA will also explore other potential areas where co-operation would be of mutual benefit.

6. Confidentiality

The parties agree to keep confidential any information which is disclosed or obtained and which is not publicly available or already known and not to disclose such information to third parties, otherwise than in accordance with the consent of the other party or as required by law or any relevant regulatory authority.

7. Anti-Bribery and Anti-Slavery Measures

- 7.1. Each Party undertakes to the other to comply with applicable laws, regulations, codes and sanctions relating to anti-bribery and anti-corruption and each other's respective anti-bribery and gift and hospitality policies (where applicable) as may be amended from time to time, copies of which will be provided on written request.
- 7.2. Each party shall ensure that it and any persons or subcontractors involved in the delivery of the objectives of this MOU shall comply with all applicable anti-slavery and human trafficking laws, statutes, regulations and codes from time to time in force.
- 7.3. Breach of this part 7 shall be deemed to be a material breach and in case either party breaches this part 7, the non-breaching party may terminate the MOU immediately by written notice.

8. Intellectual Property Rights

- 8.1. All intellectual property content that is developed jointly by the Parties after the commencement of this MOU will be jointly owned by the Parties and subject to any other terms and conditions that will be worked out on a case-to-case basis, as may be agreed upon in writing.
- 8.2. Any intellectual property that is owned by either of the Parties, pre dating this agreement, and is exploited or modified under this MOU, will remain the sole property of that Party. It will therefore not be reproduced or transmitted in any other form or by any other means, electronic or mechanical, including photocopying, recording on any storage or retrieval system, without the prior permission and written consent of the intellectual property owner.
- 8.3. Use of logos, trademarks, intellectual property, copyright materials, etc. will be in accordance with each organisation's guidelines. Neither Party shall use, nor permit any person or entity to use the name, logo (or any variation thereof), intellectual property, copyright

materials, etc. of the other party without first obtaining the other Party's written consent.

9. Assignment



This Memorandum of Understanding is entered into on the day of 16th November, 2019 by and between the Khagol Mandal, hereinafter referred to as KM, and the Department of Physics, SIES College of Arts, Science and Commerce (Autonomous), Sion(W), Mumbai, hereinafter referred to as DoP.

1. PREAMBLE

Khagol Mandal (KM) was founded in July 1985 by group of people keen propagate scientific awareness in the society. It is a registered Public Trust as well as Registered Society. In past 34 years, KM is seen as one of the most active astronomy popularization group and has an annual outreach of over 10,000 people. The group is run by volunteers only.

SIES College of Arts, Science and Commerce (Autonomous) is an autonomous college under University of Mumbai and is recognised for distinction in the teaching of several subjects including the Arts, Natural Sciences, Commerce and Media Studies. The Department of Physics is known for its excellence in teaching and promoting science. It has always endeavoured to train students to contribute knowledge in the subject at the local, national and international level.

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is an outcome of the desire of both these institutions to enter into a collaborative programme of spreading knowledge of Astronomy among the student community.

2. PURPOSE

The aim of this MOU is primarily to establish a written document under which both the institutions may enter into a collaborative programme of teaching and practical observation of Astronomy.

3. AREA OF COLLABORATION

KM and DoP, agree to conduct a joint programme in Astronomy for students of SIES College. The students may come from all disciplines and levels of education as offered by the college.

4. TERMS OF REFERENCE

- (a) KM will facilitate setting up of an Astronomy course for the students of SIES College in collaboration with the DoP.
- (b) The course will comprise 32 hours of theory and about 12 hours of practical sessions. It is proposed to commence the programme in the first week of August 2019.
- (c) The purpose of the course is to add value to the education provided by the college, and is not intended to generate revenue either for the DoP or KM.
- (d) Theory sessions:
 - (i) The theory sessions will be held in the college premises.
 - (ii) The broad outline of the theory syllabus will be as follows. This may be subject to modification.

(iii) The DoP agrees to provide a classroom, audio visual equipment such as a computer, Internet connectivity, projector and screen, and all other accessories that are required to deliver high quality advanced level classroom sessions.

(iv) The timings of the theory sessions will be determined and announced in advance for the benefit of the students.

(e) Practical field trips:

(i) There will be one observation session at the KM observation site. The date will be declared later.

(ii) The students will pay for the field trips, as per the costing pattern defined by KM for the field trip.

(iii) A minimum of one faculty member from the DoP will be required to attend each field trip.

(iv) The students will be required to take full responsibility for themselves during the field trips.

(v) The students will be required to observe the discipline and itinerary fixed by KM. They will be provided with a list of 'dos and don'ts' prior to each trip.

(vi) KM will not be held responsible for any unexpected or untoward incident during the practical observations. This includes direct or consequential injury, loss, inconvenience or damage.

(vii) KM will determine whether any of the observation sessions needs to be repeated in the event that conditions are not conducive for proper observation or activity. Should such an eventuality occur, the cost of the additional field trip/s will be borne entirely by the DoP and/or by the students.

(f) Payments:

(i) The DoP agrees to bear the entire cost of organising the collaborative course on Astronomy and field trip as per the course.

- (ii) Transport to and from the venue of the practical observation site, dinner and any additional purchases during the field trips will be paid for by the DoP and/or by the students as agreed between the respective parties.
- (iii) The cost of any additional field trips that are required to be conducted out of necessity or choice will also be borne by the DoP and/or by the students as agreed between the respective parties.
- (iv) All payments for the entire course will be made directly by the DoP to the respective payees.
- (v) The course fees for 2019 batch will be Rs. 2200/- per student excluding GST. KM will get Rs. 1,500/- per student (Rs. 500/- for Sky Trip to be paid separately) and DoP will get Rs. 700/- per student from the above fees.
- (vi) The course fee for subsequent courses, if any, will be mutually decided by KM and DoP.
- (g) The programme will be promoted entirely by the DoP.
- (h) At the end of the course, each student who successfully completes the programme will be awarded a certificate jointly by KM and the DoP.
- (i) The nodal authorities for this programme shall be the Head of the Department of Physics, SIES College and a Course Coordinator from Khagol Mandal.
- (j) Both parties agree that disputes, if any, will be sorted out mutually, Principal SIES and President KM will be final authority to settle the dispute.
- (k) This MOU shall be effective from the date of signing the same and shall remain in effect for the respective academic year.







NOW THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE MUTUAL PROMISES SET FORTH IN THIS MOU, THE PARTIES HERE TO AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

CLAUSE 1: CO-OPERATION

1. Both Parties are united by common interest and objectives, and they shall establish channel of communication and co-operation that will promote and advance their respective operations within the Institution and its related wings. The Parties shall keep each other informed of potential opportunities and shall share all information that may be relevant to secure additional opportunities for one another.
2. First and Second Party co-operation will facilitate effective utilization of the intellectual capabilities of the faculty of First Party providing significant inputs to them in developing suitable teaching/training systems, keeping in mind the needs of the industry.
3. The general terms of the co-operations shall be governed by this MOU. The parties shall co-operate with each other and shall, as promptly as is reasonably practical, enter into all relevant agreement, deeds and documents (the 'Definitive Documents') as may be required to give effect to the actions contemplated in terms of this MOU. The terms of Definitive Documents, this MOU shall represent the entire understanding as to the subjects matter hereof and shall supersede any prior understanding between the Parties on the subject matter hereof.

CLAUSE 2: SCOPE OF THE MOU.

1. The budding graduates from the institution could play key role in the technological up-gradation, innovation and competitiveness of an industry. Both parties believe that close co-operation between the two would be of major benefit to the student community to enhance their skills and knowledge.
2. **Curriculum Design:** Second Party will give valuable inputs to the First Party in teaching/ training methodology and suitably customize the curriculum so that the students fit into the industrial scenario meaningfully.
3. **Industrial Training and Visits:** Industry visit and Institution interaction will give an insight in to the latest developments/requirements of the industries; the Second Party to permit the Faculty and Students of the First Party to visit its member companies and also involve in Industrial Training Programs for the First Party. The Industrial training and exposure provided to students and faculty through this association will build confidence and prepare the students to have smooth transition from academic to working career. The Second Party will provide Labs/ Workshops/Industrial sites for the hands-on training of the learner enrolled with the First Party.

9. **Planning and Management of Activities** - Each distinct collaboration program or activity will be described in separate 'Activity Agreement' drawn up jointly by the collaborating units, and signed by the heads of these units. Such agreements will specify the names of those individuals on each institution responsible for the implementation of the program.
10. **Funding of Activities** - There is no financial commitment on the part of the SIESASC, the First Party to take up any program mentioned in the MOU. If there is any financial consideration, it will be dealt separately.
Activity Agreement should make financial costs and obligations explicit. Collaborating units are encouraged to work together to identify and secure any outside funding which may be needed. Projects requiring funding must be approved by both institutions.
11. **Placement of Trained Students:** Second Party will actively engage to facilitate and help the delivery of the training and placement of students of the First Party into internships/jobs.
12. **Limitation and Warranties:** Each party shall ensure that the other is not put to any liability for any act of the respective party under this MOU.
Each Party represents that they have full power and authority to enter into this MOU in general.

CLAUSE 3 INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY:

1. Nothing contained in this MOU shall, by express grant, implication, Estoppel or otherwise create in either Party any right, title, interest, or license in or to the intellectual property (including but not limited to know-how, inventions, patents, copy rights and designs) of the other party.
2. Both the Parties may receive information proprietary to other Party (the "Confidential Information") in the course of performance of their obligations under this MOU. Confidential Information is not meant to include any information which (a) is publicly available (b) is rightfully received by the Parties from third parties without accompanying secrecy obligations; (c) is already in either Parties possession and was lawfully received from sources other than the parties or (d) is independently developed by the Parties. The two bodies understand and acknowledge that the Confidential Information is valuable and confidential and agrees that it will at all times be kept in trust, to be disclosed only to such persons as have a "need to know" the same for the effective implementation of this MOU and that it will only be used by the parties for the benefit of others.
3. Both the Parties understand and agree that all written or other tangible data and documentation developed or procured by the other Party in performing its obligations under this MOU, whether in printed or electronic form, belongs to other party and that other party will have all rights, title and interest therein.

CLAUSE 4 VALIDITY:

1. This agreement will be valid until it is expressly terminated by either Party on the mutually agreed terms.

2. Either Party may terminate this MOU by providing 60 days advance written notice to the other party. In the event of Termination, both parties have to discharge their obligations.
3. **Modification** - The terms of this Agreement may be changed or modified only by written amendment signed by authorized agents of the Parties hereto.

CLAUSE 5 RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE PARTIES:

1. It is expressly agreed that First Party and Second Party are acting under this MOU as independent contractors, and the relationship established under this MOU shall not be construed as a partnership.
2. Either Party shall not use the name and brand of the other party in any advertisement or make any public announcement without the prior written approval of the other.
3. Any and all disputes or differences arising out of or in connection with this MOU or its performance shall, so far as it is possible, be settled by negotiations between the Parties amicably through consultation & understanding.
4. Either Party shall indemnify and hold each other harmless from and against any claim, loss, liability, or expense, including, but not limited to, damages, patent and trademark infringement, costs and attorneys' fees, arising out of or in connection with any acts or omissions of their agents or employees.

CLAUSE 5 NONDISCRIMINATION:

Either Party agree that no person shall on the grounds of race, color, national origin, gender, sexual orientation, or creed be excluded from participation under the terms of this agreement.
