The Value Lab Association joined hands with Start Up-cycling Now (SUN) an NGO dedicated to be generous to the planet and learn the various ways we could recycle and upcycle waste.

Report: For Generosity as the value for the month of February, the speaker Mrs. Natasha, the CEO of SUN gave an insight on sustainable practices, on effective management of our waste and encouraged all of us to start segregating garbage in the house. Listening to the side effects of throwing out E waste without segregation was a revelation to everyone listening. Mrs. Natasha asked the students to fill out a form if they would become e waste ambassadors and help collect their locality's e-waste. To make things more exciting she announced it as a competition and if we were able to collect 100 kgs of e waste, she would give us some fun events (gift coupons) to enrol for free.

As a follow up of the talk, The Value Lab Association in collaboration with SUN Start Upcycling Now and the NSS of SIES College of Arts Science & Commerce conducted an Electronic Waste Drive. The target for the drive was 100 kgs. The CEO of SUN, Mrs. Natasha D'Costa encouraged the SIES students to volunteer as e-waste ambassadors and conduct the drive at our own local levels, collecting electronic waste from societies, friends, family members and other associations that the students might belong to.

In the SIES college premises itself, cardboard cartons were placed in the foyer. A total of 21 students, 15 from NSS and 6 from Value Lab volunteered as e-waste ambassadors. At the end of the drive, a **total of 350 kgs of E-waste** was collected. Value lab collected around 200 kgs, NSS collected 80 kgs of e-waste. Pick-up trucks were sent to the localities of the e-waste ambassadors as well as the college to collect the waste, some to be disposed of correctly while others to be upcycled.

The E-waste drive was a huge success. It gave us students the opportunity to take charge, be ambassadors for the planet and initiate sustainable ways of living on the earth. All the volunteers received participation certificates by the SUN organization.



FEEDBACK ANALYSIS:

As per analysis, the majority of our audience belonged to the Humanities department. 66.7% of responses were from students from FYBA and 33.3% were from students from FYBA.

With respect to the data collected, we can conclude that the audience was moved and intrigued and inspired by the session to a great extent.

When asked how they would like to show their generosity towards the planet, the common responses were by saving and conserving water and electricity, growing plants, disposing of waste items properly and recycling plastic, e-waste etc. They also feel that the least one can do is not litter the surroundings and use a bin, which is a very valid point too.

Some even quoted the 3R formula to be very effective, ie Reduce, Reuse and Recycle.

The main takeaway from the session was that the students/ audience learnt about the community impact of waste segregation and management, and important facts about dry, wet waste and e-waste. They also learnt how landfills pollute the environment, methods to manage dry waste, and the significance and necessity of curbing the pollution by using the 3R formula.

The audience expects the Vale Lab Association to host more sessions on various topics like Stress Management, Self-Management, the Impact of Covid-19 on India's economy and so on!

Report: Everyone wants to be happy in life. A human's end goal is also to reach complete happiness. But it is rare to find one who knows how to achieve happiness. The Value Lab Association of SIES College of Arts, Science and Commerce (Autonomous)organized a workshop on the Secrets of Happiness. On the 25th of September 2021, Dr. Aravind Raghavan gave an eye-opening and interactive talk. With this month's value being Spirituality, this event was exemplary.

The audience were the students from classes 9th & 10th of SIES High School, Matunga. The session was interactive with students enthusiastically wanting to share their thoughts. Dr. Aravind Raghavan, started by asking what we seek in life. It could be eating your favourite meal, getting the first rank in class, being angry at a person and so on. He continued speaking that if we remove anger all that is left is peace and calm. The endeavour of human life is happiness. Now, where can one find happiness? For a person, happiness can be having a new phone or being rich, but real happiness lies within us. It is in our own mind and body we can find happiness. Dr. Raghavan said the secret to our happiness is to be Awake. With every letter in the word 'Awake' having a meaning, one can find happiness. The first A stands for Aim of Life. Our aim in life should be permanent happiness and freedom from sorrow. Our life is an accident, because the world consists of an internal world of thoughts and feelings and an external world of consciousness, and we value experiences over feelings. This was followed by a small video clip from the animation movie Kung Fu Panda, where the main character finds inner peace during his final battle. Naturally as human beings we all have needs but from time to time we keep a check on them. The W in awake stands for Work as Worship. The next A stands for Alter of Concentration. Here, a fun activity was performed. Three students were to volunteer to sign their favourite song. Each of the students sang different songs individually and then all together at one go. This activity showed us how chaos takes place in our minds. If there is chaos there is no concentration. We should hold on to one line of thinking. To strengthen our concentration, we can indulge in concentration exercise daily for a few minutes. K stands for Know Yourself. We are so interested in gossip about outsiders that we don't listen to our own body and mind. If we spend some time just by ourselves, our mind will be cleared. We should ask questions about the things we have taken for granted. We don't appreciate the little things in life and by doing so we can be at peace. E stands for *Equipoise*. Here we learnt how we should never be attached to anything for too long. We all hear the common saying 'This shall pass' when someone is feeling low. But while experiencing happiness the mantra 'This too shall pass' is used. Because we should never be attached to it. Whatever the moment is, we should be in it at that time and then move on.

He concluded the seminar by explaining that if we indulge in all the five letters, we can achieve happiness in our life. He told us how an awakened person is a person who functions from happiness instead of happiness. This workshop was followed by an active question answer session and concluded successfully with a formal vote of thanks.


Report: Hope is a wonderful sense of pleasure where one finds light after facing darkness all alone. The Value Lab of SIES College of Arts, Science and Commerce (Autonomous), with Hope as the value for the month of July held a splendid interactive session with special guest Benaifer Khisay, a Remedial Educator and specialises with children with learning disabilities, along with her Dr. Uma Shankar the Founding Person of Value Lab and Principal of SIES College (A); Dr. Kamala Srinivas the Chairperson of Value Lab; Mrs. Kalyani Arumugam Headmistress of SIES School, Matunga and Mrs. Usha Jayaprakash, Mrs. Manju Phull teachers, SIES School were part of this session.

This session was mainly held for the school students of SIES School, Matunga, who were between the ages 12 to 15 years. Benaifer being experienced with school children knew how to communicate and relate with the 12- to 15-year-olds. Started off with how everything has changed since the pandemic and every walk of life is going through some difficult situation and having hope could bring back that normalcy. "Who can give you Hope?" an open question she asked to the attendees. Little voices of 'my family', 'my mother', 'teachers' and many more were the answers. Why hope? Why do humans crave that feeling? Benaifer explained, scientifically, research found out that people who believe highly in hope have lower levels of anxiety and depression, they are also more creative and better at problem solving. Most of these people are positive in nature and don't take failure personally. She mentioned to reward ourselves for every step we complete, to keep ourselves happy and reassure ourselves. A very important statement she made that moved the audience was to never compare ourselves to someone superior to us. As human beings we are so used to comparing ourselves to something unattainable that it has become completely normal, not realising what a toll it is taking on our mental health. From time to time, we should take two steps back, look at the picture as a whole, someone may be facing a harder situation than us and we should be glad that isn't us. This helps us to see things in a different perspective and we can handle the situation better. "Things Take Time" an inspiring message that helped Benaifer in her tough spot. Telling us to be patient and wait for our achievement to be rewarded.

The event was concluded successfully with very interactive question and answer session.

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



How relevant was the talk with regard to the value 'HOPE'? $_{\rm 63\,responses}$





(1: Very Rarely & 5: Very Frequently)


After listening to the talk, how often will you use the value 'HOPE in your daily life? 63 responses



FEEDBACK ANALYSIS:

The audience for this session was majorly from the Secondary Section of the SIES High School, Matunga. Out of the feedback received, 77.8% found the talk to be excellent and in line with the topic. Aim/Concept:

This event alms to fulfill several things on our checklist which include: Reduce the use of plastic by selling bags. Also, educate children about how harmful plastic is and why we should switch to eco-friendly products. Teaching underprivileged children, new cloth painting techniques. Another motive behind carrying out this event - The money from the sale of the tote bags is used for the educational needs of the children.

Ground Work:

15 days before the event, the plan was prepared and the same was approved by the Vice-Presidents. Authorizations and other formalities were coordinated with Ms Yogita Salvi, owner of Swayam Mahila Mandal.

The Project Chairpersons decided to organize the event in collaboration with Swayam Mahila Mandal and Vaishnavi Mahila Mandal.

A total of 100 carrier bags, 2 boxes of fabric paint and paintable vegetables were purchased 10 days before the event.

A JPEG and PR message was posted in the official RCSES WhatsApp group and circulated to other groups to publicize the project and its purpose, A Google form was created and circulated by Project Chairpersons for ordering tote bags. On September 29, 2021

Project Chairpersons along with the club members visited children in Vikhroli. The event started at 2pm. It started with introduction of Chairpersons and the Rotaract Club.

Then they asked all the children to introduce themselves and a nice introduction session gave the event a positive and cheerful note. They informed the children why plastic is harmful and also explained to them why they are raising money through the event to help them with their education.

They also explained to them the difference between regular paint and fabric paint and how they would use fabric paint to design the tote bags. The volunteers taught them to paint vegetables on fabrics with a lady finger.

When the painting was finished, they wrote a note that read "Please help us" and their names on the note. The goal was simply for the buyer to know the name of the person they were donating for. The volunteers clicked pictures with it and handed out cookies.

Miss Yogita Salvi, Editor-in-Chief of the newspaper 'Tarun Bharat', covered the entire event live on Facebook. The prof.t made from the sale of these bags was used for educational purposes for the children. All the bags were delivered to the respective buyers.

Summary:

Children learn new painting techniques and have hands-on experiences to be creative. We have promoted the use of canvas bags over plastic bags among shoppers and children. Contribute to the education of disadvantaged children. In a way that they don't feel like someone is doing a favor on them as they took the effort to paint the bag. The price of one bag was Rs 14 and sold for Rs 35.

Follow-up (Feedback):

Children were convinced that plastic is bad for the environment and they should use eco-friendly products.

They also decided to further promote this message. Miss Yogita Salvi (owner of Swayam Mahila Mandal) appreciated us for being from Generation Z and still understanding the importance of using bags like we used to and how dangerous plastic is.

She also mentioned that the Rotaract Club of SIES College, Sion (W) always has unique event ideas.

The children had fun and asked us to do more such events with them. Miss Manju (owner of Vaishnavi Mahila Mandal) asked us to hold more events with them and this time for the empowerment of women in their mandals. We thanked both organizations for allowing us to run the event.

- Day 4: Anti-trafficking Center Organization: Prema Foundation, KhetwadiDate: 27th April, 2022 4:00pm to 6:00pm. Finally, after relief from COVID and exams we were back with the opportunity of TDJ 6.0 being held in person. This organization's kids loved face painting so they insisted on doing that. Following the drill, we visited the organization and introduced our club and the event. We distributed the kids in the group of 6 and provided them with colors. All of them were so talented they painted spiderman, smileys, bunny, scenery, tiger on each other's faces. All of them were looking so adorable with painted faces and innocent smiles. The kids were very well-mannered and cooperated with us. We played a few fun games with them to interact and get to know them. Once they were done painting, we appreciated them with certificates and pouches (sponsored). A Vote of thanks was given by the Chairperson and the day was concluded. The organization had strict child protection policy under which we were not allowed to click photos. The organization members clicked pictures and sent us the same but we are not allowed to upload or use anywhere on social media.
- Day 5: LGBTQ Organization: The Rainbow AllianceDate: 14th May, 2022 6:00pm to 7:30pm
- This event collaboration was very impactful for us. The Rainbow Alliance is a part of SIES College, Sion (W). We prove that different organizations from college can come together and create an amplified impact in the community. The Rainbow Alliance is an organization set up by students to create a better environment for the LGBTQ community. As the college was not functioning, we decided to do an event online where we had a drive link wherein the participants uploaded their videos. We had online meetings with the organization for the flow of events and participation from their end. Around 3 mock trials were taken with the MOCs making sure the event goes on smoothly. A zoom meeting link was sent across the Rotaract groups and the rainbow alliance organization. We started the event with an introduction of the club, event and the organization. Later, the videos were screenshared followed by a lot of cheering and appreciation in the chat box. A special introduction for each participant was given before playing the video. Many participants performed amazing dances, songs, drum playing, guitar playing, drawings, photography, poems etc. At the end vote of thanks and citation were presented. The day came to a delightful end.
- Day 6: JuvenileOrganization: Juvenile Home, Sandhurst RoadDate: 16th May, 2022 2:00pm to 4:00pm. After endless efforts, we finally got permission to conduct our event with the juvenile kids. We were strictly not allowed to talk to them about anything personal or share our contact numbers if they asked for it. As it was already informed by the organization we had to conduct a drawing competition. We provided them with drawing paper, colors and sketch pens. Following topic was decided for them ~ "What do they want to be in the future?" Some of them made a hospital as they wanted to become doctors, some made school, airplane etc. Each one of them participated actively and made the best drawings. We played a few games with them. As there were some restrictions we couldn't interact or click pictures. Overall, it was a fun day for them and they enjoyed it. They even asked us to visit again next week. We provided them with certificates and water bottles and the day ended.
- Day 7: OrphanageOrganization: The Salvation Army Children Home, Sion (E)Date: 17th May, 2022 9:00am to 11:00am. The organization gave
 us the permission to conduct the event but strictly in the given time as they had other daily routines lined up. All the participants were girls and

they were very cheerful and interactive. The organization had conducted dance workshops in the past so everyone was very good at dancing. The girls were very active and participated in the event actively. They performed group dance, solo dance, and sung songs. We were happy to know that they were given dance training and it clearly showed in their performances. Also, here for safety purposes we weren't allowed to take many pictures. We played passing the parcel with them for fun and interacted quite a lot about their hobbies, what they wanted to be in future etc. We provided them with biscuits as requested by the organization. Lastly, certificates and water bottles were given as an appreciation to children and the day ended with bright smiles and happy memories.

• Day 8: Tribal KidsOrganization: Kawthewadi, Neral. This category as the name suggests was far away from where we stayed. Thanks to our enthusiastic OC as they traveled carrying all the gifts and speakers. This organization radiated a different kind of energy, full of zeal and literally brought out the charm of Talent Dikhlaja being a festival. They were all prepared with their dances. Their hospitality was amazing. As soon as we reach them they offer us water, food etc. We started the event with the introduction of the club and event. We had to converse with them in their local language Marathi. So for the first time we prepared the introduction in Marathi language. They have a big hall where all participants were ready in their amazing outfits all dressed up for their performances. It was so cute to see small girls wearing their traditional Maharashtrian sarees. We had a lovely audience, all the people from the village gathered to encourage their kids. Kids performed group and solo dances on Marathi songs, the dance form was also tribal. It was so good to see the traditions of our state. Constant cheers and applause were going on as a new participant performed. We provided them with certificates and water bottles as appreciation. We thanked the audience, participants and the organization heads for giving us permission and being co-operative. The event finally concluded with happy faces and cheer in the atmosphere.

Follow-up (Feedback)

- We got a lot of positive feedback about the event from our sponsors and college heads. The organizations were glad and thanked us for conducting
 the event with them and giving their kids a platform.
- We shall be continuing the same project in coming years as well. Making sure we add some new categories to it. Adding LGBTQ category this year, we extended our support towards them.
- We would try adding new categories like acid attack survivors, domestic violence survivors, mouth and feet painting, blind kinds in our future project which we couldn't do this year because of COVID-19 restrictions.

Aim/Concept:

The aim of this event was to make learning interesting and exciting through live experiments for the Interactors of Interact Club NES High School. Learning can be very interesting and enjoyable if properly learned. Since children are very impatient, there is no better way than to show them this by experimenting. We wanted them to understand that science can be interesting.

Ground Work:

The motive behind conducting Science Made Easy is to introduce experiments that Interactors can carry out inside their house. This makes learning science in a new and fun way. We picked out 2 easy yet effective science experiments to carry out at home. The first experiment was to educate them approximately acid-base reactions, in which they were requested to get turmeric, washing powder, lemon juice and water. Rtr. Kamala Thakur, Sports and Partners-In-Service Director carried out this experiment where she started off by adding turmeric to the water and requested the interactors to comply with her, she then added washing powder to the turmeric water and asked the interactors about the change in the color of water. They answered saying the color had changed to RED from YELLOW. Later she asked them to add lemon juice to the mixture, the water again turned to YELLOW. This shows how acids and bases react when mixed together. Since the second experiment dealt with a lit candle it was a little dangerous, so Rtr. Smruti Tawde performed it while the interactors watched. She wrote RCSIESSW with LIME JUICE on a piece of paper and held the paper above the lit candle. Slowly the white paper started to show the text written with the lemon juice and it started turning BROWN. This shows the invisible ink experiment, The event ended successfully with Project Chairpersons appreciating and

acknowledging the efforts of the interactors.

Follow-up (Feedback):

No post work meetings were required for this event. All the participants truly enjoyed the event and loved the idea behind it. The teacher Coordinator Sujata Ma'am of the NES School, joined the event too and thanked us for conducting such an event which will also help the students academically. Most students who attended the event had the following similar feedback: Teacher I like both the experiments very much I really like the experiment

Aim/Concept:

Thalassemia is a blood disorder involving lower-than-normal amounts of an oxygen-carrying protein. The aim of this event was to hold a Human Leukocyte Antigen Test, for Thalassemia patients and their families. The test was conducted under the guidance of a professional. Our aim was to serve the community through this event and also ensure Rotaractors gain exposure and interact with experienced professionals as they run the tests with the help of professionals. The event also aimed to strengthen Rotary, Rotaract and Inner wheel relations while creating impact in the society.

Ground Work:

Volunteers were assigned portfolios such as Crowd Management, Swab Testing, Verification and Registration. Once the event began, patients and families of patients with Thalassemia began arriving.

24 .nembers from our club made sure everything was carried out smoothly and with proper care. The volunteers were given detailed instructions and guidelines on their responsibilities. The instructions were as followed:

 After a form is filled up by the responsible person, it must be thoroughly cross-checked for all the fields by another person, before taking the cheek swab. It's very important. 2. The person responsible for entering the data in the system must ensure that the entries in the system tally with the total number of forms.

3. This rule applies to the person responsible for scanning the forms as well.

4. The volunteers responsible for managing the crowd must ensure that there are not more than two families at Mr. Madan Chawla will brief the whole process to all the volunteers on the spot before the camp begins, and he will be there till the end for any guidance and support.

Some members were at the registration desk, dealing with administrative work. A few of the members were allocated for crowd management, handling the patients and family members who had begun to arrive. Some members were responsible for collecting the swab tests while some were collecting data from everyone.

As everyone entered the premises, their personal information like their name, etc. was noted down at the desk. Once they had provided the necessary details and were registered, they were directed to the swab testing location.

Rotaractors then collected their swab tests with all the necessary precautions to be taken. The Rotaractors had their masks and gloves on while taking the swab test. These swab tests will be sent to a German lab for testing and each test is of market price 12,000/-

Once the swab test was completed, we had Dr. Dua who was examining everyone. He had a record of the patient's medical history and had their previous reports as well.

The event was very insightful as he shared his knowledge and expertise about this field with us. After the tests were done, the volunteers were provided with snacks. Team Vice Presidents presented their vote of thanks. The event concluded with Volunteers expressing our gratitude for having been a part of the wonderful event and the chance to serve the community and create a tangible impact. Event chairpersons thanked everyone for being part of such great initiative and also hoped that members will continue doing their part as a rotaractor.

Summary:

The project helped the Rotaractors to understand and learn firsthand more about Thalassemia. It was an insight as to what Thalassemia is, how it affects patients and how they cope with the disorder. We also got the experience of working under a professional and came to know how the swab testing is done. The project was a medium for the members to understand and work with alongside the Rotary and the Inner wheel. Through the project, we could reach out and help 175+ individuals.

Follow-up (Feedback):

No post-work meetings were required for this event. All the volunteers loved the opportunity to work under a medical professional and perform a swab test. They truly enjoyed the event idea of serving society in a way that affects the lives of patients. They were happy that they could learn more about thalassemia under a professional. When we discussed the feedback for the event, the members said that they would like to volunteer for such activities more often, and the Rotaractors who weren't able to attend expressed their desire to do more such projects since they also wanted to be a part of more such events. Aim/Concept:

With the upcoming winters, Mumbai seems to pay no heed to lowering temperatures, rather recording the hottest and wettest days of November. We aim to make a change in everyone's lives. Hydration is the most basic necessity for an individual, so we decided to provide it to our hard working laborers. Lemonade with Glucon-D will help the laborers stay hydrated in the scorching heat and give them an icy cool break from work. But who will prepare it for them? We approached the wonderful women of Mahila Mandal to help us prepare the drink for them.

Ground Work:

After the event blueprint was approved by the team, we went ahead with the preparations of the event. A jpeg and PR message were created and released on the club's official WhatsApp group. An order of 10 litres of lemonade was placed with the supportive and cooperative women of Vaishnavi Mahila Mandal. We bought paper glasses and also placed an order of 50 hot and freshly prepared samosas with a local vendor. On the day of the event, 3 volunteers visited the Mahila Mandal and collected the lemonade from them. At 3:00pm, all the volunteers gathered at Gajanan Maharaj Chowk, Vikhroli. Volunteers visited the construction sites and introduced our club to the workers around. We also explained to them that we have brought some freshly prepared lemonade and hot samosas for them and we would be glad to help them. The Head at the site granted us permission to proceed and we went ahead with the distribution. The lemonade was filled in paper glasses and samosas were distributed among the workers. A garbage bag was provided to collect the glasses and to avoid mess. We were able to cover 3 construction sites in the neighborhood. A total of 75+ workers were benefited by this initiative and the volunteers went home with smiling faces.

Summary:

We initially thought of distributing water to the workers to beat the heat. But they strive all day to earn a living, and work in the scorching sun to fill their

stomachs, why not add some taste to their drinks and make them smile? The workers were very content to have received a tasty snack and drink in the middle of work and blessed us for this initiative. The women of Mahila Mandal were grateful to us for placing an order with them and contribute to providing employment to the women of the Mandal. They also insisted on getting more orders for food tiffins. The volunteers felt a sense of responsibility and gratitude to help the laborers and take part in this initiative.

Follow-up (Feedback):

We would like to help and provide employment to Vaishnavi Mahila Mandal by ordering food tiffin and promoting their work in future events. We also presented a citation to the women of Vaishnavi Mahila Mandal for their amazing contribution. Members insisted on conducting the same event in coming quarters on a larger scale.

Aim/Concept:

Ever wondered where the chips packets or toffee wrappers end up going? A look around might tell us that it might be part of the litter spread on the road, or still lying around in the nearby dumpster. We're all aware of the grave state of plastic contamination in our oceans and how plastic has become everyone's number one enemy. So, what if we told you there's a way to cut down on the quantity of plastic that ends up in the ocean? Plus, it only takes 2 minutes of your time and you can do it from the comfort of your own home? What precisely is this amazing method that has capacity to solve the world's most pressing issue right now? Eco bricks are one solution to reuse this plastic waste and build something useful from it. Instead of throwing the plastic waste and bottles we can make eco bricks with them. It is a small yet very important step towards conserving the environment.

Ground Work:

After the approval of the blueprint, we went ahead with the preparations for the event. This event was divided into two phases: Phase 1 was an online session conducted on the Zoom Meetings App. The highlights of the session were: The chairpersons, Rtr. Tharani and Rtr. Eshaan aimed to provide an in - depth knowledge to our volunteers about the concept of eco bricks. A presentation was presented to the volunteers to explain the process through visual representation. We talked to the volunteers and guided them on how eco bricks are made. A step by step process was provided to all the volunteers. We informed them about the materials and what can be included in an eco-brick and what must not be a part of an eco-brick. We also told them about the use of eco bricks at various levels and how it is economic and sustainable.

After Phase 1, A separate WhatsApp group of volunteers was made who would collect plastic waste in 11 days span and then join us on ground to make eco bricks. Keeping in mind the COVID situation, we restricted the number of people to 15 volunteers for the on ground phase. RSVPs took daily update of plastic collection on the group. Volunteers were suggested to inform the stores in their locality where plastic usage happens on a daily basis to store these plastics for the good cause. They were also asked to spread message regarding eco-bricks to their friends, family and local store owners. On 28th December we gathered at a terrace in Chembur and started preparing eco bricks. As instructed, volunteers brought a bag full of plastic waste, scissors, and stick. Plastic waste from each volunteer was gathered and we started cutting small pieces of plastic. All the volunteers filled the bottles and compressed the waste using a stick. We were successful in making 7 eco bricks. We wish to continue this process until we make a good number of eco bricks. We would donate it to a NGO where they already make shelters from eco bricks and are in need of more.

Summary:

An Eco brick is a reusable building block made by packing solid non-biodegradable garbage into plastic container to a specific density. The bottles are excellent building blocks for nearly any construction because they are packed with a set density. They can also be filled with non-biological non-recyclables that are dangerous to the environment if not contained.

Because plastic trash is a long-lasting and robust substance, Eco bricks are a sustainable solution to utilize non-biodegradable plastic waste. As a result, plastic is kept out of the ecosystem, preventing environmental contamination. A proper reuse of plastic was done by this initiative. Not only we were able to manage our plastic waste and give our bit to the environment but also we will be able to make a shelter for animals at a very minimal amount. Members of our club as well as the general public were educated about Eco bricks as a result of this effort. Even small contribution counts, which is why we were pleased to learn that local store owners, general public were thrilled with this concept and went out of their way to support the cause by informing their customers and friends and family.

Follow-up (Feedback):

E-Citation of appreciation was presented to all the volunteers. Event chairpersons did take follow up with all the volunteers regarding the plastic collection and motivated them to do this wholeheartedly.

We wish to conduct more such initiatives with different sections of the society to create awareness.
